EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:

REVISED 2024 BUDGET AND RELATED 2024 PROFESSIONAL FEE

AMENDMENTS: Mr. Sacco said the EJIF 2024 budget that was adopted at the January 8, 2024 meeting has been revised to reflect a new member, Willingboro MUA, who joined February 1, 2024. The change is .05% and does not need to be filed with the state. The change in membership slightly changed the professional fees for Fund Attorney, Executive Director, Underwriting Managers, Environmental Services and Claims Administrator. The revised budget is included in the agenda and Resolution 17-24 amending the contracted amounts for certain Fund Professionals.

BANKING SERVICES REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP): The MEL's Joint Cash & Management Investment Program (JCMI) oversaw the release of an RFP for banking services and later this morning the MEL will discuss the appointment. At our next meeting in June the EJIF will discuss the outcome of the MEL's decision and decide if the Fund will follow the MEL's lead. No action will be taken today.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURES: JIF Commissioners should anticipate the online filing of the Financial Disclosure forms inclusive of any other municipal related positions that require filing before the deadline of April 30th.

ACTUARIAL IBNR REPORT- Enclosed in Appendix II is the Actuarial IBNR estimates valued as of December 31, 2023 for review. The Fund's actuary will provide a verbal report.

NEXT MEETING - The next meeting of the EJIF is scheduled for Monday June 10, 2024 at Forsgate Country Club, Monroe Twp, N.J.

DUE DILIGENCE REPORTS: Mr. Sacco said the yearend Fast Track report shows surplus down \$956,000, which is mostly reflecting the \$2.5 million dividend returned in 2023. All years combined shows a surplus of \$15.7 million and the Fund remains in excellent financial position.

ATTORNEY:

Mr. Semrau said there is a multi-state litigation regarding PFAS and approximately \$22 billion has been placed in available recovery funds by the contributors. There are deadlines for entities to

come forward and be considered for these funds in the event of future claims. Mr. Sacco has been meeting with EJIF members and also attorneys that specialize in this area to make sure that members as well as other claims in the MEL system will have coverage for future claims in this space and protect ourselves going forward.

Mr. Semrau said Mr. King continues to work on the Passaic River / Newark Bay settlement Part 2, it seems to be geared toward a settlement and costs are coming to a standstill. As in the Part 1 of this litigation, Mr. King is working to protect our members and set up the recoveries.

UNDERWRITING MANAGER:

Mr. Charles Casagrande said members need to retain full polices on site for underground storage tanks in the event they are visited by the state. In regard to our new members from the Atlantic JIF, the Fund honors retroactive dates when there is prior coverage.

ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEER:

Mr. Erickson said they have been busy reviewing new member surveys and approximately two-thirds of the Atlantic JIF members have returned completed surveys. His office has completed most of the audits and so far only two Atlantic JIF members have regulated underground storage tanks.

Currently he is gearing up for the education and outreach programs that occur this time of year. A Stormwater presentation was made to Trico JIF members and they will be giving the same presentation to Burlco JIF members.

The New Jersey Water Environment Association (NJWEA) conference is this month, and Mr. Erickson will be providing eight hours of CEU accredited training, specifically on air pollution engineering. There is a free modeling tool available that can predict what your flood level risks are, and expenses tied to it. Mr. Erickson encouraged authorities to contact him with any questions or at the conference if attending.

ACTUARY:

Mr. Kullman said the completed 12/31/2023 IBNR analysis was included in the agenda and is estimated at \$6.03 million. IBNR has been stable over the past 12 months as the change from year end 2022 is less than \$200,000.
